Circular to all the colleges in West Bengal for PG Medical/Dental final college level Mop Up 2018

Some seats are found to be still lying vacant in the colleges/institutions in West Bengal after completion of the Mop Up round of WB PG State Quota and Pvt Management Quota counseling and admission 2018.

The list of the candidates who are NEET PG 2018 or NEET MDS 2018 qualified, registered for counseling in WB PG 2018 and not allotted till Mop Up round, is provided by NIC Kolkata.

In view of the above facts and in pursuance to the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India vide WP Civil 267 of 2017 on 9th May 2017, the vacant seats and pooled non allotted candidate list is forwarded to the colleges in West Bengal for consideration of college level admission.

The college authorities are to inform such candidates through phone number and email ID regarding such vacancy and willing candidates may attend the office of the Principal/Director of the College on 18.05.2018 at 2 pm (cut off time). The attendees will be called according to combined merit for admission provided they produce requisite documents in original and fees for the concerned college.

All admission closes by 6 pm on 18.05.2018.

The college authority will admit form non-allotted list provided to them after verifying the particulars of intending candidates who registered attendance for admission in a particular college for a particular subject. This is pertinent to mention that the admission will be based purely on merit among the attendees of respective colleges.

On 19th May 2018 the colleges must report to the undersigned through email id controller@wbuhs.ac.in the admitted candidate list with courses in their college whose admission was conducted on 18th May 2018.
